## **Event Recycling Cheat Sheet and Recommended Sorting Process**

## **Recommended Sorting Process**

- 1) Keep a hand on top of the lid of the waste receptacle (if there is one) and physically open it for people (you will be amazed at how quickly a person can throw something in the wrong bin if you're not alert!)
- 2) Narrate the process make this exchange educational for the attendee
  - a) Example: "Hi there, what do you have? Well, we're going to put that can in the recycling bin [open recycle bin] and everything else you have can be composted [open compost bin]!"
- 3) If there is an item that you are unsure about, set it aside and alert your event coordinator as soon as you can without leaving your station
  - a) Remember: there is a \$20/hr fee if there is contamination to be removed from the waste containers, so reducing contamination will save money!
- 4) Talk and interact with the attendees
  - a) Part of your job as a waste station monitor is to be an educator, raise awareness of waste reduction, and promote compost and recycling efforts
